Libya addresses the pressing issue of traffic accidents, which have resulted in alarming statistics, including 4,131 accidents and 1,761 deaths in 2021 alone. The project aims to combat this crisis by focusing on comprehensive solutions, highlighting the causes such as excessive speed, driver incompetence, and inadequate transportation means. It emphasizes proactive measures, especially targeting distracted driving and mobile phone usage, often neglected due to a lack of law enforcement and safety protocols. The project's significance lies in its approach to raising awareness and promoting safe road behavior to mitigate the devastating impact of traffic accidents in Libyan society.

VIA deployment

The VIA programme for safe mobility for all young people in Tripoli, Libya, is funded by TotalEnergies and implemented by Moomken Organization for Awareness and Media in partnership with the National Oil Corporation and the Ministry of Education

Its mission is to encourage and train young people to become ambassadors of safe mobility so they can be safer on their way to school ... and beyond. Its main focus is to improve the safety of young pedestrians on their way to school.aimed to promote traffic safety awareness among children. The program covered six municipalities and faced challenges in some areas due to communication issues and unexplained delays. Despite the challenges, the team successfully engaged with 41 schools, involving 35 trained instructors. Students received drawing supplies, breakfast meals, and training on safe road behavior, resulting in positive responses from both students and school administrations. The program effectively achieved its goals, enhancing traffic safety awareness and contributing to safer road behavior in Tripoli.

MAIN RESULTS :The campaign started on the 3/18/2023 was implemented in 41 schools, reaching 2,054 students.
