Road Safety in TANZANIA

More than 16,000 people die on Tanzania's roads annually, according to World Health Organisation figures. Road crashes are the leading cause of death for children and young adults aged five to 29 years old.

In Tanzania there have been reported 67 injured students, 77 students' deaths within the year 2022 with additional of 26 deaths and a reduction of 3 injuries. In 2023 from January to September there have been reported to have 68 injuries and 30 deaths related to students' pedestrians.

VIA deployment

VIA has been implemented in 2 Regions and 6 Districts in Dar es Salaam and Bagamoyo Pwani,

We started the project 16Th September – 10th November involving 49 Schools and 6,090 Students.

- School selection: identification, information and confirmation of participation;
- Training of trainers and Teacher training sessions;
- VIA Awareness phase in the schools so all the children will understand the risks they daily undergo on their way to school.
- VIA Creative competition (Engagement phase 1) and VIA Safe Mobility Ambassadors (Engagement phase 2); groups of motivated students per school have further analysed the risks, discuss options on improvements to be made to the

way to school, prepared actions on awareness and prevention, designed final prevention posters which they have shared with the rest of the students, their families and in their community. Each school has chosen its winning group of ambassadors and its poster.

- VIA District events have been organized with the school winners and a VIA national final with the best group and poster from each of the participating cities was organized to chose the VIA Ambassadors representing Tanzania that will participate in the International VIA Finals.
- The best posters will be reproduced and used for permanent messaging on safe mobility at the schools
